Dear Friends of the Crucified Messiah,

2017 IS THE 500th ANNIVERSARY of the beginning of the Lutheran Reformation, so this Lent and beyond, we will consider the rich Biblical and theological treasures we have as Christians with a Lutheran heritage.

"THIS WE BELIEVE" is the theme of our Lenten midweek services, which begins on March 1, Ash Wednesday. For the first time, we will offer midday services at noon in addition to our regular 7:00 p.m. Lenten services. These noon services will last about 30 minutes. Hopefully those who do not wish to drive at night and those who cannot attend at 7:00 p.m. will take advantage of these noon services. This is an experiment, and the response will help us decide whether to continue this in coming years.

Here is the schedule for our Lenten mid-week services:

MARCH 1: Ash Wed. - LUTHERANS ARE DIFFERENT - An introduction to the 95 Theses

-Imposition of Ashes for those who wish and the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

MARCH 8: GOOD NEWS IS CENTRAL- Proper preaching

MARCH 15: HOW GOD "GETS 'ER DONE" -The Means of Grace

MARCH 22: HOW CAN WATER DO SUCH GREAT THINGS? - Baptism

MARCH 29: THERE IS GOOD MONEY IN BAD RELIGION - An old problem still with us

APRIL 5: THEOLOGY OF THE CROSS - The truth about what the Bible says

APRIL 13: MAUNDY THURSDAY- God's Work, Not Ours

-The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

APRIL 14: GOOD FRIDAY - God at Work under Opposites

LENT IS A SOMBER SEASON. It is a time when we consider the extreme and costly measures our Lord took to put us in a right relationship with God. God's forgiveness is a free gift to us, but it was very costly to our Heavenly Father. His only Son suffered and died for us and for this world our Lord so dearly loves.

In wisdom Christians who went before us handed down this season of focusing on the Passion of our Lord as we anticipate celebrating that sin, death, and evil will not have the last word. Our God has the final word and that word for us is "hope" not "despair." "Yes," not "no." "New life," not "death."

Outreach Updates

From HOPE to LEAP: Helping At-Risk Children in Madison

Outreach has been working to find new ways to address the needs of at-risk children in our community. In addition to providing support for *House of the Harvest* and the *Weekend Lunch Program*, we have been seeking ways to reduce the need for these programs by trying to tackle the origin of poverty in our community. ***We believe that one of the keys to breaking the cycle of generational poverty is to establish long term relationships.***

To achieve this goal, we initially proposed that Madison City Schools implement the HOPE Leadership Academy in all seven elementary schools and both middle schools in Madison. After much discussion, Madison City School administration has decided to develop their own program, beginning at a single elementary school (Horizon Elementary) with ties to a single middle school (Discovery Middle School).

We accept this challenge and have begun working with Mr. Rodney Richardson, the principal at Horizon, and Jennifer Walker, the counselor at Horizon and co-founder of *House of the Harvest* with her husband Adam. We are creating a new program called the LEAP Academy in Madison that we intend to be a seed program that will be adopted throughout the system.

The goals of LEAP are very similar to HOPE Leadership Academy. The program will target at-risk children to build ambition, goals, self-esteem, and leadership in at-risk children in Madison. Our goal is to build a framework that will establish the necessary long-term positive relationships between at-risk students, teachers, and the community that will allow a trust and advocacy that are necessary for success.

Consistent with our original proposal to help at-risk children in Madison, we have moved our focus from implementing the HOPE Leadership Academy in Madison to building and supporting the LEAP Academy in Madison.
