

Dear Friends of the Living Messiah,

WORSHIPING OUR LORD IS THE CENTER of our life together as Messiah Lutheran Church. Worship is the hub of the wheel and all else rotates around it. For many among us who are excited about the beginning of Incarnation Lutheran Church a key question is, "When will worship begin?" (Tentative plans are for July.)

WORSHIP WAS OVERCROWDED at MLC on January 11. Folding chairs were set up behind the back pews to accommodate everyone. Some of the people on folding chairs were guests, not members. This was a glaring example of a recurring situation: Each month Messiah Lutheran has overcrowding in worship at one or several services.

THIS IS GOOD! It means more people are receiving the gifts our Lord freely gives us in worship. We do not want to have members or guests stop coming to worship because they feel there is no room for them. We discussed this at Church Council in January. Two options seem obvious: 1) Expand our sanctuary to increase seating capacity, or 2) Add a third Sunday service of worship. Option 2 is not only less costly, it can be done much sooner. The Council discussed a revised Sunday schedule. Next a meeting of Sunday servers and leaders met and came up with the following possible schedule:

- 8:00 a.m.: Service of Worship** (a simplified, shorter service)
- 9:00 a.m.: Service of Worship**
- 10:15 a.m.: Sunday School**
- 11:15 a.m.: Service of Worship**

CHANGE IS PAINFUL. If this change is tried, everyone would be on a different schedule from what is familiar. (This certainly will not make Sundays easier for our Altar Guild or any of us in worship leadership.) Perhaps the question to ask ourselves is: 'Am I willing to adjust so more people can receive the gifts our Lord gives in worship?' At Messiah Lutheran we have a history of not doing things to be most comfortable, but to be faithful in mission. (That is one of the primary reasons why I love this church.) There will be more discussion and study. At the February 19th Council meeting action may be taken to experiment with a new Sunday morning schedule from March – May.

'WHAT IF THIS DOES NOT WORK?' We can adjust. If we try this experiment for the coming months, the Congregation Meeting in May would seem an ideal forum to decide what is prudent for the future of Messiah Lutheran Church. It is our Lord that we worship and this is our Lord's Church. Yet, our Lord speaks through our corporate deliberation on matters like this. Thank you for your faithfulness. In a time when most Christian congregations are wrestling with declining numbers, you are one of the reasons Messiah Lutheran is seeking ways to faithfully pursue the growing mission our Lord intends for us.

What is a Stephen Minister? A congregation member who is recruited, selected, trained, commissioned, and supervised by Stephen Leaders to provide one-to-one Christian care to persons in need on behalf of the congregation. Stephen Ministers typically are assigned one care receiver at a time and meet with that person for about one hour each week. Stephen Ministers usually serve for two years, which includes an initial 50 hours of training followed by twice-monthly supervision and continuing education sessions. Want to know more?
