#### **QUESTION OF THE MONTH**

If God's chosen nation is Israel, why don't the Jewish people accept Jesus as the Messiah?

Some Jewish people do accept Jesus as the Messiah. (Our tour leader in Israel last November, Hillel, is a 'messianic Jew'). Here are three possible explanations for why most Jews do not accept Jesus as Messiah.

- 1.) Many Jews (and non-Jews) have never heard the *good news* we have in Jesus. It is our mission to share that good news by our words and actions.
- 2.) Only the Holy Spirit brings people to belief in Jesus as the Messiah. So, only God knows why some believe and others do not. (See #1 for what we are to do about this.)
- 3.) St. Paul struggles with this very question in Romans chapters 9-11. His is not a simple answer, but it is the best one I know because it is in the Bible.

#### Outreach News by Jacquie Fry

It looked like spring lately, but winter weather has returned and it will be with us for a while. Homeless people in our community are in shelters such as the Salvation Army or Downtown Rescue Mission, but others live in tents under the overpass on I-565 and it gets cold. First Stop is the place where the homeless can get help and supplies. Currently First Stop serves approximately 125 homeless persons - mostly men, but recently more women have become homeless and need help. Items needed: blankets, coats, sweatshirts. adult socks, gloves, hats, & scarves.

There is a list of needed supplies for the First Stop Homeless Center posted on the board in the hall. There will be a separate box next to the box for coats and blankets for any supplies you want to donate. Hotel size soap is preferable for homeless clients but shampoo can be large, as it can stay in the shower at First Stop and be used by many clients. The center works with its clients to get them into permanent housing and was able to find housing for about 30 clients in 2011. These people have none of the household goods needed to set up housekeeping. Old dishes, pots and pans, cups, silverware, towels, etc can help to get a formerly homeless person settled. It doesn't matter if things don't match. If you have larger things such as furniture, please call First Stop to see if they have room in their warehouse.
