Dear Friends of the Living Messiah,

WHY DOES THE CHURCH EXIST? The short answer is 'mission'. But so much is packed into that word 'mission'. What is the Church's primary mission?

FIRST, the Church exists to **worship** our Lord and Savior. A metaphor that Martin Luther liked to use: *Worship is the fountainhead*—Everything else flows out of it. God calls us to do many things, but all of them flow out of our worship of God. To put that another way: We are a worshiping community that has education and outreach and youth ministries and fellowship activities and lots of other things. We are not an education community that also worships; not a social club that also worships. First and above all else, we are a worshiping community.

THE MONTHS WITH THE MOST GUESTS in worship are July and August. Many of those guests come looking for a church home. Not many attend a class or an activity to decide if they might want to come to worship. So, worship is the biggest doorway to welcome people into MLC. What is most important to them as they look for a church home?

"THEY MOST WANT TO HEAR GOOD MUSIC," a musician might think. "They most want to hear a good sermon," a pastor might think. Well, yes, they do want to hear good music and God's Word. But, most important for most newcomers is this: "Will these people accept me and care about me." Above all they want compassion and community. Even if the music is great and the sermon is too, if they sense they are surrounded by people who are uncaring and cold, they will go elsewhere or (much worse) give up on finding a church home.

SEE WHAT YOUR MISSION IS NOW on Sunday mornings? Find a guest and find a way to say, "Welcome." OK, what if you don't know if the person is a guest or some long-time member you just don't happen to know? How about this, "I'm (your name here). I don't believe we have met"? Now, if you have hooked into a live prospect, try to find a way to introduce the person to Claire Strand, or Pastor Mark, or me. (But, I will tell you a secret: You taking the time to welcome them will make a much bigger impression than any of us on staff will. That's because guests think I am just doing my job when I welcome them, but when you care that says much more to them about Messiah Lutheran Church.)

COME TO WORSHIP, even though it is summer time. Look for guests and say to them, "Welcome to Messiah Lutheran Church." When you do, you might be talking to an angel *(see top of page)*.

A monthly update from Pastor Mark Borseth

Our target After a setback, we are starting to move toward getting in a building and starting Sunday worship. It just won't be as soon as we had hoped. The building we were looking at by the Harvest Post Office fell through due to occupancy code issues. With the building falling through, the date to begin Sunday worship also needed to be pushed back

As of right now (assuming building code issues work out – which they are much more likely to do in this newer building) we are exploring the possibility of renting a building on Highway 53 about a mile south of Publix. If we have enough expected offering income to make renting the building feasible, we hope to move in on August 1. And if we get in this building, we plan to have our first Sunday worship at 10:45 on Sunday, September 13. If the building doesn't work out, we will keep looking. Weekly Bible study will begin once we are in the building.

If you want to be part of this ministry in any way – helping with music or nursery, donating chairs or tables, being part of a Bible study or committing to attend worship regularly while we get started, making donations to help with building costs each month – your assistance would be greatly appreciated. Of course, the greatest gift you could give would be your regular prayer for this ministry.

If, in fact, we start Sunday worship in September, my family and I will not be at Messiah on Sunday mornings or Wednesday nights so we can use those primary times of connection with people to be in Harvest. That will be very hard since we have been so blessed to be at Messiah.

I will continue to be involved in ministry at Messiah, but my visibility will decrease quite a bit. I will continue to work with the Senior Youth and other ministries that don't happen on Sunday morning or Wednesday night.

Thanks for your prayers and support for Incarnation. It is a blessing to be working with you to begin this new ministry in Harvest-Monrovia. I will let you know more details as we make final decisions regarding the new building and the starting date for Sunday worship in Harvest.
