Dear Friends of the Living Messiah,

WHY DOES THE CHURCH EXIST? The short answer is **"mission."** But so much is packed into the word "mission." *What is the Church's primary mission?*

"WORSHIP IS THE FOUNTAINHEAD" is a metaphor Martin Luther liked to use. Everything flows out of worship where God's Word is spoken and the Sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper are celebrated. As we are the Lord's Church, God calls us to do many things, but all of them flow out of our worship of God. To put that another way, we are a worshiping community which also does education, outreach, youth ministries, fellowship activities, and lots of other things. We are not an educational institution that also happens to worship. We are not a social club that also worships. *First and above all else, we are a worshiping community.*

THE MONTHS WITH THE MOST GUESTS IN WORSHIP are July and August. Many of the guests in those months come looking for a church home. Notice: *They come to worship to see if this might be home for them.* Not many attend a class or an activity to decide if they might want to come to worship, so *worship is the widest entryway to welcome newcomers into Messiah Lutheran. Okay, what is most important to them as they look for a church home?*

"THEY MOST WANT TO HEAR A GOOD SERMON," a preacher may think. **"They most want to hear good music,"** a church musician may think. Of course, guests in worship do want to hear good music and preaching. But most important for newcomers is this: **"Will these people accept me and care about me?"** Above all, they want *compassion and community.* Even if the music is great and the sermon is, too, if they sense they are surrounded by people who are uncaring and cold, they will go elsewhere or (much worse) give up on finding a church home.

SEE WHAT YOUR MISSION IS NOW ON SUNDAY MORNINGS? Find a guest and find a way to say "Welcome." You ask, *"What do I do if I don't know if the person is a guest or a longtime MLC member?"* Try this: *"I'm [your name here]. I don't believe we have met."* Next, if you have hooked into a live prospect, try to find a way to introduce the person to our Outreach Director, Claire Strand, or to someone you think has things in common with the guest. And I will tell you a secret: YOU taking the time to welcome them will make a much bigger impression than any of us on the church staff will. That's because guests think we are just doing our jobs when we welcome them, but when you care, that says much more to them about Messiah Lutheran Church.

COME TO WORSHIP, even though it is summer time. Look for guests and say to them, *"Welcome to Messiah Lutheran Church."* When you do, you might be talking to an angel (*see above*). And you might be talking to a new lifelong friend.





Hymn of the Month

"Guide Me Ever, Great Redeemer"

The text of this hymn was written by William Williams (1717-1791), an itinerant minister. Williams was on track for a medical career when he was converted and began preaching. He traveled over 95,000 miles and often drew large crowds. Later this text was set to the tune by John Hughes (1873-1932), a Welsh deacon and has been sung at royal weddings and funerals in England. The text features rich biblical references, including the people of Israel's deliverance from Egypt, God's subsequent providential care in the wilderness, and the crossing of the Jordan River into the Promised Land of Canaan. The "bread of heaven" or manna in the wilderness also has a greater vision to Jesus' statement in John 6, "I am the Bread of Life".

Sanctuary Piano Dedication

The piano was made by Steinway and Sons in their New York factory. Steinway is an American piano company started by the German immigrant Heinrich Steinweg in 1853 in Manhattan. The first piano was given the serial number 483 because Steinweg had made 482 instruments prior to coming to America. This piano is number 484671, which indicates that it was completed in 1984.

Steinway makes 6 different grand pianos, varying in length from about 5' in the S model to 9' in the D, which is the piano we have here. They are handmade. And with about 12,000 parts, each one takes about a year to make. They are made not only from wood and metal, but various kinds of wool felt, as well as leather. The woods are carefully chosen for their strength, resilience, and tonal properties. The rim of the piano is made of layers of hard rock Canadian maple. Tension is built into the rim as the layers are bent and glued in a press invented in the 1880's. The metal plate inside the rim is cast iron. It holds the tension of the strings and prevents the piano from pulling itself to pieces – when the 243 strings in a D are in tune, there's over 20 tons of tension on the frame.

The strings are not actually string, but wire made with precision by Mapes Wire in TN. The composition and diameters are carefully chosen so that when each string is pulled to tune, it is within a few percent of the total tension needed to break the string. The soundboard is made of Sitka spruce from Alaska. Much like a violin or guitar, the soundboard is what amplifies and colors the sound of the vibrating strings. The Sitka Spruce is one of the key determinants of the piano's sound. The string tension and sound are transmitted into the soundboard by a bridge – just as in a violin. It's not flat, but arced upwards like the top of a violin. The keys are cut from a single slab of Bavarian spruce, and their surfaces are made of a plastic polymer – Steinway stopped using Elephant ivory in the 1950s.

Of course, the most important thing about a piano is its sound. The sound of every piano is slightly different due to the natural materials used to make it and the tensions built into the instrument by the manufacturer and the technician. There is no one right sound. Steinway's are clear but complex, much like our religion and faith. The complex series of overtones and the way they interact cannot be analyzed or understood by striking a single key. It is the way that string interacts with others through the bridge, the soundboard, and the rim which gives each piano its unique character.

One of the beauties of an acoustic instrument is that its sound can be molded differently by each performer in the way they touch the keys, a reflection of their personality and how it interacts with the tension and flexibility of the natural materials in this instrument. The piano is one of the beauties of God's creation. It demonstrates the truth in Martin Luther's statement: "Next to the Word of God, the noble art of music is the greatest treasure in the world." —John Shriver

Music opens hearts. Praise, thanksgiving, joy, sorrow, supplication, exhilaration, meditation... music reveals and releases emotion. Through music, God speaks and reveals His great love for us and through music, we can communicate with God. In worship, we join voices as one in unity and fellowship with our Maker, Redeemer, and Guide...and with each other. Through the poetry of hymns, the Word of God is sung and proclaimed.

So when we began the piano search, our goal was to find an instrument that had enough presence to carry through the church, enveloping all those worshiping and encouraging participation. We also needed an instrument which had the versatility and range to communicate our diverse prayers to God in worship. Upon first hearing and playing this instrument, it was apparent that this piano has a beauty that can lift spirits from darkness, rejoice with the saints, calm troubled hearts, and remind us of God's love. The beauty and eloquence of music is a gift from God. Sharing this gift is a responsibility and blessing that is ours. (See WOV hymn #699 *The Singer and the Song*). With this instrument, we hope to glorify God in worship and also serve God by reaching out to the community. May music always turn our hearts and minds to God, the giver of all good gifts. Thanks be to God! —Lois Graff
