-Luke 9:2-3

Dear Friends of the Living Messiah,

ONE PAIR OF SHOES AND ONE PAIR OF PANTS WERE ENOUGH.

A bathroom sink worked fine for washing clothes. For 25 days I lived out of a 21" bag that fit above my seat on flights to and from Germany. This "traveling light" adventure was inspired by the following excerpts from ***The Gift Of Simplicity: Cut The Clutter And Save Your Soul*** by David Yount:

Simplicity is Sensible.

By the world's standards, Americans appear to be acquisitive, but we are generous, too, and sensible about simplifying. You don't have to embrace poverty like Francis of Assisi to recognize the wisdom of traveling light. When Francis appeared twelve centuries after Jesus, Christianity was virtually immured within monasteries and cathedrals. Francis recognized that faith and love reside not in buildings but in the heart. The Spirit is portable and resists being locked up.

To carry the good news of the Gospel, the friar and his followers had to be mobile, thereby enabling Christianity to break through institutional walls. Generations of believers and skeptics alike have been charmed by the friar's simplicity while sometimes suspecting him of naivete'. But Francis's spirituality was the utterly practical product of simplifying his life. The poor friar was the richest man of his time.

Simplicity begins with a leap of faith—faith in oneself and, for many, faith in their Creator. Simplicity will enable you to leap lightly. Increasingly you will find yourself living in a state of grace, finding (as Francis did) the sacred in the ordinary, the mystical in the mundane. Shedding regret for the past and concern for the future, you will begin to live fully in the present moment, which is the closest thing on earth to eternity.

Simplicity begins sensibly...You may wish to scrutinize your life for any excess baggage—not just material possessions, but affections, beliefs, and prejudices that bog you down and impede your pursuit of happiness...

Complex machines are more likely to break down than simple tools. The same is true of your life. You are seeking to establish (or reestablish) a functional, integrated life, which is a life marked by integrity. The simpler your life, the less there will be to manage or wear out because there will be fewer working parts. You will be able to concentrate on the things that produce the most satisfaction without worrying about accessories that malfunction.

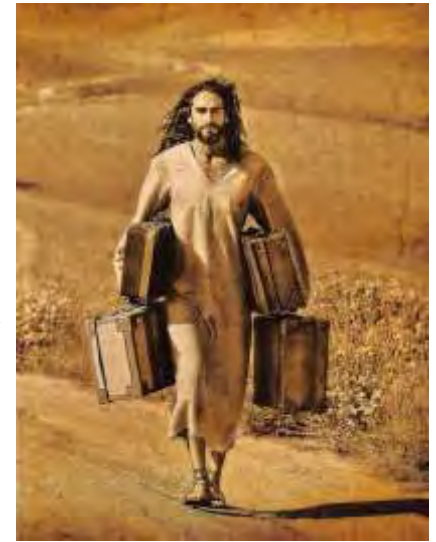
JESUS TRAVELED LIGHT THROUGH THIS LIFE. He trusted that His Heavenly Father would provide all He needed from day to day. Indeed that is what happened. What "baggage" can we drop to be more free to serve as disciples of Jesus?

MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT: Ring and Sing turns 20

Messiah's Ring and Sing Program celebrates its 20th year on Sunday, December 9th, 2018. The free public event begins at 6:30 p.m. with a light reception to follow in the Fellowship Hall. The Ring and Sing program provides an opportunity for Messiah's Notabella Bell Choir, choirs, and instrumental groups to present festive holiday music to the community. The decidedly casual, family-friendly music program lasts about an hour.

A few favorite traditions have emerged over the years. The challenging and entertaining handbell piece "Caroler's Hoedown" by the Handbell Quartet always delights! Another tradition is the audience participation numbers where the audience plays hand chimes as a few traditional Christmas carols are sung. Beyond the few stray notes that are rung, the joy of singing and ringing together is always memorable. Another tradition of the Ring and Sing is the free-will donation at the door to support the Madison County Library.

Notabella welcomes ringers 7th Grade and up. While it's naturally helpful if you know how to read music, the key ingredient for a Messiah ringer is the desire to learn and the availability to rehearse. The bell choir presents special music for Messiah's Worship Services at least once a quarter, though sometimes more frequently. Depending on the time of year, rehearsals take place either Wednesday or Sunday evening.
