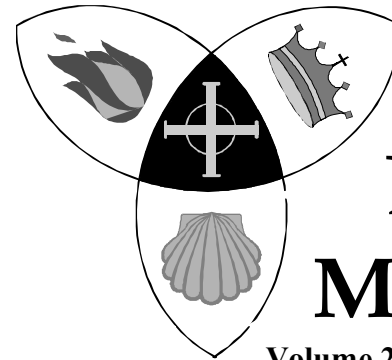

Dear Friends of the Messiah who came to live among us,

WHAT A MESS!!! We hear wave after wave of bad news. When people we love (or we) are the ones losing jobs suddenly this becomes more than just cold statistics. We are talking about hurting people and we are among them. For many of us what we have saved through decades of persistent financial discipline and hard work is evaporating overnight. Others of us have a more profound loss. All we can see is darkness when the question is: "How can I possibly live without my beloved?" *What a mess!*

WHAT A MESS!!! This whole world is bent on rebellion from God. Not a 'cyclical downturn' or a 'phase we are going through', this is the oldest news. From Adam and Eve to you and me, all of us have sinned and fallen short. No 'bail-out' will save us from this mess we have created. This will kill each and every one of us. *What a mess!*

GOD HELP US! Well, **good news**, God did exactly that. That is the Christmas story. Our God, who created everything including us, did not stay detached from the mess we made. God, in the person of Jesus, came to earth, taking on human flesh like ours, and took care of everything. Our Lord did not remove the consequences of our sin. And, our Lord did not prevent us from dying--because dying is exactly what we need. *Our old sinful selves need to die.* God is at work now to raise up a new you and me.

CHRISTMAS IS ABOUT INCARNATION. That means: *God took on flesh and lived among us.* In God's infinite wisdom, God decided *incarnation* was the way to fix what we broke--our relationship to the God who made us, loves us, and wants the best for us now and forever.

INCARNATION is the name Pastor Mark has chosen for the new Lutheran church just conceived for the Harvest/Monrovia area. Our Lord was conceived, grew in secret, and then entered this world to bring God's good news for this messy world. So too, this new congregation is now just a twinkle in God's eye, but quickly it will take shape with hands, feet, and a heart determined to care for those in the midst of this messy world.

INCARNATION is also the theme of our Advent mid-week services this year. On Wednesdays, December 3, 10, and 17, come and listen as Pastor Mark, our Sunday School children, and I '**put flesh**' on the good news of our Lord coming to earth to fix this mess.

THANK YOU, LINDA.....HELP WANTED

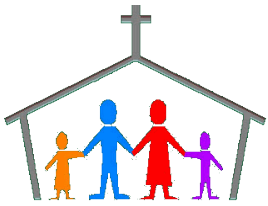

"Incarnation Information"

An Update from Pastor Mark on the Harvest Mission Congregation

It's good to be here! Since my family and I arrived on November 1, you have made us feel very welcome. Thank you! So, now that I am here, what do we know about the new congregation in Harvest that wasn't previously known?

First, we have a tentative name – Incarnation Lutheran Church. That is where the name of the update (Incarnation Information) comes from. I will try to pass "Incarnation Information" to you in each monthly newsletter and on the link on the Messiah website.

Why "Incarnation"? I want to make sure the new congregation is constantly reminded to keep their directions straight. The temptation of religion in general is to focus on what we do to get to God, and the motion tends to be from earth toward heaven. But Jesus comes to turn the direction around. Christianity is not how we escape the flesh to get to heaven, but how Jesus chooses to take on flesh and blood to bring heaven to us. That is what "Incarnation" means – "in flesh". Just as he comes to us to bring salvation, he sends us to be his presence "in flesh" in the world.

Incarnation keeps the direction clear. He comes to us in the flesh and sends us into the world to be his body in the world. The direction of salvation is God to us. The direction of Christian life is God with us and in us going into the world. Yes, the day will come when he will come to bring us out, but for now our call is to go in and be an Incarnation of God's love and power in the world.

Once the name is finalized and we have a phone number and email address, a brochure will be developed and visits in the community will begin. If you have questions about the new start or want to be part of what we are doing, please let me know.
