

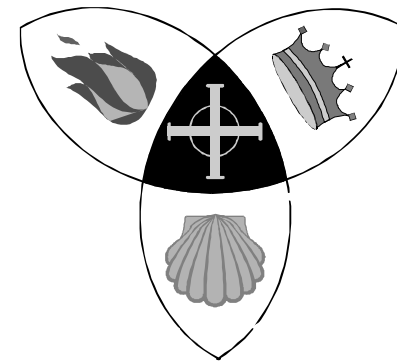

Dear Friends of the Messiah who became one of us,

HOW DO YOU PICTURE John the Baptist? How do you picture the angel Gabriel announcing to Mary, "You will give birth to Jesus"? How do you picture the birth of Jesus? At our mid-week Advent services we will look at how artists have pictured these people and events that are at the heart of our faith. Artists deliver messages in their work. We will search for messages in some famous depictions of John the Baptist (Dec. 2), the Annunciation to Mary (Dec. 9), and the Nativity of Jesus (Dec. 23). (The children will present their Christmas program on Dec. 16.)

A PICTURE is worth a thousand words. *Every picture tells a story.* Those are two old adages that speak of the power of the visual. Jesus often told stories bringing familiar (and often surprising) images to the minds of His listeners. Down through the ages the Church has used painting and sculpture as tools for handing on our Christian faith especially when the vast majority of people could not read. When we can picture someone or something we are on the pathway toward understanding.

HOW DO PEOPLE PICTURE YOU? I am not asking what appears in your mirror, but what crosses peoples' minds when they think of you. We all know people who just the thought of them makes us smile, or shake our heads, or laugh, or feel sad.

HOW ARE YOU DOING WITH YOUR SELF-PORTRAIT? Advent and Christmas are great seasons to touch up our self-portraits because this is a time of giving. We celebrate our God giving us what we most need: A Savior. We all look more godly when our hands are open to give rather than clenched to hoard or fight. Hopefully we also know that the greatest gifts we have to give are not material.

COME CELEBRATE the greatest gift ever: Jesus the Messiah, our Lord.

ADVENT SERVICES are Wed. at 7 p.m. with Holden Evening Prayer.

CHRISTMAS EVE worship with Lord's Supper will be 4, 6 and 8 p.m.

CONGREGATION VOTES to FORM BUILDING COMMITTEE

At the Congregation Meeting on November 15, a motion passed to establish a Building Committee. (This Committee will be appointed by the Church Council.) In the motion the Congregation approved expenditures of up to \$18,000 from the New Facilities Fund for detailed architectural drawings for expanding Messiah Lutheran's current sanctuary. This is not a final decision to build, but these steps are necessary to allow the possibility of enlarging the sanctuary. A proposed floor plan and an architect's rendering of the external view of the enlarged sanctuary are in the narthex.

We have now been worshipping on Sunday mornings for a little over two months. So how are things going?

- Pretty much everything we have needed for our building or for worship has been donated. God has been faithful!
- We have had good worship where people have sensed the presence of God. God has been faithful!
- We have 50 people on a typical Sunday. Of course we would like to have more, but we have a wonderful group of gifted people (including many children). God has been faithful!

Of course there are needs. We are still spending more than we are taking in each month, but the gap is getting smaller. We have a small group of people doing most of the work, but one by one new people are stepping up. It is exciting to see people who were too intimidated to offer their talents at larger churches stepping forward in our smaller setting. There is a place for the excellence that comes with a large congregation, but there is also a place for the opportunities to grow and serve available at a smaller congregation.

About the time you receive this newsletter we expect to be having a building full of people celebrating Thanksgiving together. We have several people from Incarnation and Messiah who are planning to come, and we are handing out flyers in several of the closest neighborhoods in an effort to be a welcoming place where people can have a "family" to join with and celebrate the holiday with good food and fellowship.

Much of the energy right now is going into doing what needs to be done for the building and worship, but we hope to be getting into the community more regularly over the next months. The reason we are called Incarnation is that we want to make a difference outside the building seven days a week and not just in the building for an hour on Sundays. If you have any ideas for ministries or activities that can get us into Harvest-Monrovia community, let us know. We also want our building to serve the whole community. If you know of groups that serve the community that need a place to meet, send them our direction.

We are thankful for your prayers, love, support, donations and involvement in this new ministry. Please continue to visit us for worship, ask how we are doing and how you can pray for us, find out if there is a way to donate your time or talents or finances to help us. We are excited to be doing what we are doing. The Harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few.
