

And Jesus said to (Mary, his Mother):
"Woman, what concern is that to you and to me?"
--John 2:4

Dear Friends of the risen, reigning Messiah,

WEDDINGS!!! I have never seen anything that makes families act more peculiar (peculiar sounds nicer than *'insane'*). Jesus talked about weddings several times in the gospels, but only gospel writer John records Jesus' attendance with His disciples and Mother at a wedding and reception in Cana.

"FIX IT, SON!" That is a loose translation of what Mary told Jesus to do when the wedding reception ran out of wine. From His response (see above), we get the impression Jesus was hoping to just enjoy the festivities; not to work—let alone work a miracle. Apparently weddings in those days also caused family tensions and peculiar behavior. Of course Jesus saved the day: Changing water into wine is the first miracle of Jesus in John's gospel.

WINE WAS A NECESSITY for Jewish wedding receptions in those days. A bigger consideration for us now is: **What makes for a good marriage?** The best answer is to do what that couple in Cana did long ago: **Invite Jesus.** *Invite Jesus not just to your wedding, but into your marriage.*

ST. PAUL GIVES THE MOST SHOCKING IMAGE of a marriage when he writes, "...a man will leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two become one flesh.' This is a great mystery, and I am applying it to Christ and the church." --Ephesians 5: 31-32.

CHRIST & THE CHURCH: IT'S A WEDDING!!! Talk about your 'unequally yoked' couples! Christ is perfect. The Church is flawed and unfaithful. Yet, Christ takes her, warts and all. And, you know how it goes with marriages: All that's His is hers, and all that's hers is His. So **Jesus gets us** with all our blemishes and baggage. And, **we get Him** with all His love, grace, faithfulness, perfection, compassion, understanding, gentleness, etc. etc. *(This Guy is the perfect spouse!!!)*

THESE MATTERS ARE ON MY MIND as Bonnie Jane and I prepare for the wedding of our daughter Christine this month to Nicolas van der Meer. What gives me the most hope for abiding joy in their marriage is that they have already invited Jesus to go with them through their life together.

YOU ARE INVITED TO A WEDDING RECEPTION for Christine and Nic in the Parish Hall on Sunday, July 31, 9:45 - 10:45a.m. (between services of worship). No water will be changed to wine. But, we ask for and count on our Lord Jesus' presence and we invite you too.

Disaster Task Force

The Disaster Task Force has met and begun work on MLC plans- a plan for recovery from this disaster and a plan to prepare for others. The Disaster Task Force members include Kay Spence (Chair), Pam Sparks (Secretary), Glen Long, Jack Mast, Julie Pedersen, Jacquie Fry, Chris Berry, Dan Byers, Claire Strand (Outreach), Janelle Zesinger (Outreach).

In the **immediate recovery**, we identified these areas of interest/focus:

Programs for children and youth affected by disaster - Camp Noah, God's Can Do Kids, and Gearing Up-Renew are 3 available programs we are looking into sponsoring or assisting with during the next year.

Adopt a Family - a program that partners a family in need with a congregation, enabling us to assist them in the road to recovery. This is an initial 3 month commitment with an approximate \$1200 per month commitment.

Recovery Blitz - starting in July, we will be forming volunteer work crews that will go into neighboring communities to help clean up debris, downed trees, etc. (weekend work, no age limits).

Through cooperation and coordination with Lutheran Ministries of Alabama, we may adopt a community and help them rebuild.

FEMA Form Brigade - a completed effort. Our congregation canvassed over 130 homes. In conjunction with All Saints Lutheran and Unitarian Universalist, we had over 300 homes in our assigned area!

One thing that has been stressed over and over again is that **financial contributions are the BEST way to help.**

In the long term disaster planning, we completed a congregational preparedness questionnaire and found that MLC has a way to go. Some things MLC is already doing. Others are going to take some cooperation with finance and property committees and congregation training. This disaster has opened our eyes to the necessity of being prepared and having a plan. Look for more information concerning our Preparedness Plan in the months to come, but here is a sample of what we are working on:

- Having a *safe place* to meet in the event of an evacuation (Redstone's back parking area)
- *Congregation Asset Inventory* (who has what available)
- Teaming up with a congregation outside of this area as a *disaster partner*
- *Communication/Neighbor Tree* that will help keep members connected in the event of an emergency (even if we have no power and no phones).

MLC Votes to Expand Sanctuary

In a Congregation Meeting on Sunday, June 12, 2011, the vote was 79 'yes' and 33 'no' on a motion to expand our current Sanctuary. The General Contractor for this expansion will be Garber Construction Company and the cost of the expansion is expected to be \$715,000. The contract stipulates that the work be completed in 180 days. If that happens, MLC would be able to worship in the expanded Sanctuary on Christmas Eve.



**STEEPLE and STAINED GLASS
WINDOW FUNDS**

For the new expanded Sanctuary to have a Steeple and a Stained Glass window, it will require additional gifts from members and friends of MLC. The cost of these additions is \$15,000 each. We received one gift of \$1,000 for the Steeple which is the total in that fund. The Stained Glass window fund already has over \$9,000 in it from gifts given in memory or in honor of loved ones.
