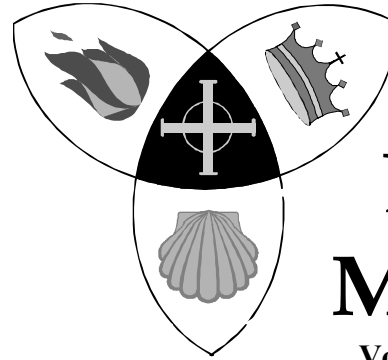

Incarnation Information – June 2009

A monthly update from Pastor Mark Borseth

Our target date for starting worship in Harvest is getting closer every day. Our plan is to do our first Sunday worship in Harvest on Sunday, July 26 at 10:00 am. Mark your calendar and plan to join us that day (and any other time you want to visit). If you are interested in becoming a part of Incarnation, whether it be as a member, someone who commits to attend worship for a period of time until we get the critical mass we need, an advisor to help us in an area of ministry (such as sound or nursery), a financial supporter, or one who commits to pray for Incarnation, please let Pastor Mark know your intent.

By the time this goes to print, we expect to have secured our temporary worship space. If things go as planned, we will be able to get in the building in June. The building we are looking at is the old Harvest grocery store across from the Harvest Post Office. The building isn't fancy, but the space should work well. It is in a very visible location with the potential of having signs on both the Wall-Triana and Old Railroad Bed sides of the building. We plan (with the help of some of you who are good with decoration and construction) to have it looking nice and feeling very inviting by the time we begin worship. There may be some work days in June and July where we will invite people from Messiah, St. Mark's and All Saints to help get the building and grounds ready. Parking had been an issue, but both the Harvest-Monrovia Water building and the Post Office have made their parking available to us on Sunday mornings. If you know someone who works at either of these places, please thank them for their graciousness.

We plan on beginning some programming once we are in the new building. In mid-June we will begin a weekly Bible study for those who are interested in the church. Even if you don't plan to be part of Incarnation, you are welcome to come to our Summer Bible study. There will also be social activities, information meetings and community outreach activities which will all be in the building. As we get into the building, we will let you know what things we will be needing help with – painting, lawn care, obtaining chairs and other furniture, etc. If you want to stay updated with what is going on, please go to the website (Incarnation-elca.org) or contact Pastor Mark to be added to the weekly email update. Pastor Mark also sends out a weekly email devotion. Anyone who would like to read the devotions can contact Pastor Mark to be added to the list or go to the website where a link to the devotions can be found.

We thank you for your prayers, encouragement and support. These next two months are critical to the success of Incarnation. Please keep us in your prayers! God's blessings!

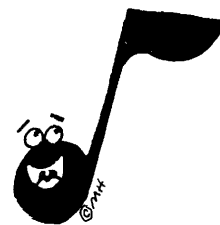

SANCTUARY EXPANSION???

At the May 3 Congregation Meeting approval was given for an expenditure of \$2500 from the New Facilities Fund to get assistance from a builder/architect on a floor plan and visual renderings of a possible expansion to Messiah Lutheran's sanctuary. The Facilities Expansion Committee will have several open forums during the summer months to solicit input from members of the Congregation and to share information. Another option for overcoming overcrowding in worship is adding another service of worship. This also is being explored and will be discussed. Watch for dates and times of these gatherings. A likely time will be 9:45-10:45 on some Sunday mornings.

On Eagle's Wings Update

On June 25, missionaries from Messiah Lutheran Church will begin their journey to villages northwest of Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories of Canada. Lois Graff will be traveling to Wha'ti to begin a week of Summer Bible School with the children and adults there. On July 2, Sue Doubleday, Kari Doubleday and Chris Berry will travel north to teach in Wekweti and Marsha Wade will join Lois to teach in Gameti. Between the three villages, Messiah missionaries will be teaching over 190 children! With God's help, the relationships that have developed through the years will foster community members to join in teaching during the week and seeds of faith will grow long after the *On Eagle's Wings* teams are gone.

Thank you for all you have done to support this ministry over the last 12 years. Please continue your prayers for the Dene and Inuit people of northern Canada that their faith will be strengthened and renewed through Summer Bible School. And please pray that the Holy Spirit will lead and guide the teachers in spreading the Good News to all of the children and adults in the communities.
