



Dear Friends of the Reigning Messiah,

WHAT DOES 'LUTHERAN' MEAN? Since this is the newsletter of Messiah **Lutheran** Church that word '*Lutheran*' must be significant to us. Perhaps you already know Martin Luther was a university professor and Augustinian monk serving a remote German university in the first half of the 16th century. The story of Martin Luther is rich and colorful, but it certainly is not his personality that defines what '*Lutheran*' means.

LUTHER'S REDISCOVERY OF THE GOSPEL transformed him. Then, as he preached and taught, all of Europe and eventually the whole world changed. What **Lutheran** means is best summed up in three "**alone's**".

THE BIBLE ALONE is the source and rule for Lutheran proclamation, faith, and life. Luther recognized the Bible is the inspired word of God to us. The Bible, not our experience, reason, culture, politics, or science, is our final authority.

FAITH ALONE puts us in a right relationship with God. This faith which justifies us to God is not our doing, but a gift from God. The gift of faith is given to us because Jesus suffered, died, and rose from the dead to save us from sin, death and the devil. Jesus and **His faithfulness** is God's definitive action for us. And...

GRACE ALONE means that it is God's unmerited favor that saves us from the powers of sin, death, and eternal punishment. We are chosen to be God's children not because we in any way deserve that, but because our Lord is loving and merciful to us.

LUTHERANS DO NOT WORSHIP MARTIN LUTHER. Rather, we are grateful that Luther was a faithful witness who points us away from our sinful selves to our Lord and Savior. In Germany the heirs of Luther call themselves '**evangelicals**', not '*Lutherans*'. '*Evangelical*' is the name Luther preferred because...

WE ARE THE GOOD NEWS PEOPLE! '*Evangelical*' comes from the Greek work for '*good news*'. (*Gospel* is the old English equivalent which also means '*good news*'.) So, what does '*Lutheran*' mean? It means we, like Martin Luther did long ago, are called to celebrate and share the good news of what God has done to save sinners like us.

WE HAVE THE BEST NEWS for now and eternity. God honored us with the joy and responsibility to share the good news of Jesus where we live and around the world. This year Reformation Sunday is October 25, when we celebrate our Lutheran heritage. See you in church.

Open Forum Notes from Pastor Scott

On Sunday, September 20, two Open Forums were held (9:45 and Noon) to discuss the decisions made at the August ELCA Churchwide Assembly allowing ordination of Pastors living in committed same-gender relationships. About 75 people total attended and shared thoughts, opinions, and questions. Unquestionably this is a troubling and divisive issue in the ELCA and the broader church.

For those who did not attend and for those who did, I will write a synopsis of the comments and discussion. This will be placed in member mailboxes at church. Additional copies will be available in the Church Office.

It was requested that future Open Forums be held on this issue as others in the ELCA also weigh and consider possible responses. Watch for notices on the next Open Forum.

My counsel as the Pastor of Messiah Lutheran Church is that at this point we exercise some patience. This does not mean inaction. It means patience so our words and actions are not pre-mature or hasty. I believe

that the Holy Spirit is at work and will lead Messiah Lutheran faithfully through this.
