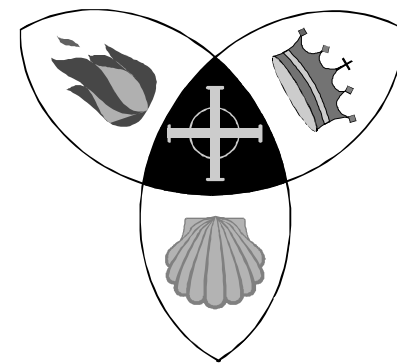

Dear Friends of the Living Messiah,

**IN TIMES OF GREAT CHANGE WHERE SHALL WE TURN?** I do not need to catalogue the many transitions and uncertainties swirling around us these days. And, you know the changes which are most unsettling (frightening?) to you. Many of us are in 'uncharted territory'. What to do? For us the answer is clear...

**HOLD ON TO WHAT IS STABLE, UNCHANGING, DEPENDABLE.** Of course, I am talking about our Lord. His forgiveness will not fail. His love will not waver. His presence is abiding. His plans for all creation (including you) are immutable. To use the words of the hymn writer: He is rock-solid while everything, everything else is slowly or quickly washing away.

**"HOLD ON TO GOD'S WORD"** was one of the rallying cries of the Lutheran Reformation which we will celebrate on Sunday, October 31. In a time of tumultuous change Martin Luther called people back to the foundations of our Christian faith. He announced that God's Word had gotten buried in all the changes down through the centuries. He insisted it was time to go back, dig deep, and cling to God's living Word revealed in the Bible and delivered in Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

**OUR PRIMARY MISSION TODAY** is the same as it was in Luther's time. We are called to hear, learn, and share God's Word for us and for all people. God's word includes the Law that gives needed structure to life and also reveals sinful people like us need a Savior. God's primary message for all is the good news of Jesus, the Messiah. In Him we have God's dependable promise of forgiveness, life, and salvation.

**HANG ON TO OUR LORD.** Hang on to His living Word. Hang on to our heritage. They will carry us through every change this world will hurl at us and lead us to life—abundant life now and eternal life with our Lord and all His children forever.

2) Sharing this ministry four hours per most days with 12 partners from Incarnation and 24 from Messiah including Pastors Borseth and Peterson as well as Pastors Fakes and Wood from St. Mark Lutheran Church and Intern Charlie Underwood from All Saints' Lutheran Church, with twelve of these partners going with us two or more times. It was good to share this ministry and come to know so many of you.

3) Observing and experiencing the gracious hospitality by regular worshippers of Incarnation both at the individual doors and on Sunday morning at worship and lunches, expressing genuine, caring hospitality for the stranger.

4) Noting the statistics of these 4 ½ weeks of work includes knocking on 2,302 doors, talking to 1,228 residents, identifying 102 who are unchurched, willing to accept information about the church and our intention to check back with them, and welcoming 14 families who came to worship at least once as a result of Initial and Follow Up Calling.

5) Noting with amazement the willingness of the many who attended a training/planning session to continue to be in contact with those who are first time worshippers, those who continue to worship and visiting those who have not yet made the visit to worship that they indicate they want to do

We are thankful to Diana Livingston who not only provided housing for us during our stay but entrusted her home to us! And we are grateful to all who participated in this program, the support of Pastors Borseth and Peterson as well as Claire Strand throughout this program. We are eager to read the upcoming newsletters and hear about your continued evangelical outreach in the community and the development of Incarnation Lutheran Church.

## RESULTS OF CONGREGATION MEETING on SANCTUARY EXPANSION

On Sept. 19, MLC approved by a vote of 69 'yes' to 18 'no' a motion to take steps enabling the possibility of expanding our worship space. The motion authorized the expenditure of \$29,000 from the New Facilities Fund to complete design development and construction documents, and to put the job out for bids by general contractors. The motion also authorized a Capital Fund Appeal to determine the Congregation's financial support for this expansion. Tentative Capital Fund Appeal dates are Feb. 6 – Mar.13, 2011.

**When will a final decision be made?** In late March/early April 2011, a Congregation Meeting will be held. At that meeting MLC will know the proposed expansion cost, what the congregation has pledged to pay for it, and how the expansion could be financed. With that information the Congregation Meeting will decide whether or not to proceed. If you wish to discuss anything relating to the consideration of expanding of MLC's worship space please talk to a member of the Building Committee or Church Council. Building Committee members are Bill Emerson, Pete Woods, Rhonda Gaede, Ed Stasiak, Janet Smith, Jack Mast, and Pastor Scott Peterson.

The first load of blankets and pillows has been delivered to the First Stop site for homeless services. Thank you. We will continue to collect blankets, pillows, and sleeping bags for homeless adults through the fall. Coats, gloves, warm socks, hats--anything that will keep an adult warm during the cold weather--will be welcomed. Feel free to add to the blanket box. Any children's cold weather wear will be given to a charity which serves children.
