

Dear Friends of the Reigning Messiah,

SHOULD THE SANCTUARY BE EXPANDED at Messiah Lutheran Church? Last November a Congregation Meeting authorized the formation of a Building Committee to pursue this possibility. So, the Church Council appointed that Committee in early 2010. The Building Committee has been working with an architect while keeping in dialogue with worship leaders and the Council as a design has been developed.

A SEPTEMBER 19th CONGREGATION MEETING will decide whether to keep pursuing sanctuary expansion or to stop the process and associated expenditures. (I like the way MLC is organized: Major decisions are made by the Congregation, not a board or an individual.)

SO, HOW DO WE DECIDE? Two big factors are pretty obvious:

- 1.) About twice a month, one of MLC's Sunday services is uncomfortably full. (As I am writing we were crowded at the 11:00 service on August 8, and crowded at the 8:30 service on August 15.)
- 2.) Expanding the sanctuary will cost a lot; a whole lot. OK, that is one reason to expand and one reason not to expand.

So, how do we decide?

So, how do we decide?

THIS IS CERTAIN: MLC IS CALLED TO EXPAND OUR MISSION.

Expanding the sanctuary would enable growth in the number of people in worship at MLC. Worship is central for us as Lutherans. On the other hand, expanding our mission could be pursued in other directions which would not require an expanded worship space.

MLC IS GOING TO BUILD on the foundation that is Jesus Christ (see above). Whether that involves bricks and mortar, wood and paint, the Congregation will decide. Or, whether that involves new mission ventures near and far, the Congregation will decide. But, our Lord and his living Spirit have already decided MLC is going to build our mission. God keeps sending more people and resources for mission, so I believe our Lord clearly has let us know that He intends MLC's mission to grow.

WHAT EXCITEMENT! WHAT FUN! MLC is not faced with decisions on how to survive, or what must be cut back. We are meeting to discern: How is our Lord calling us to grow? Let's celebrate this together. Let's decide on this together. Then, let's move ahead together with the mission of our Lord. Whatever we build, we build upon the foundation that is Jesus Christ.

Electronic Offerings Are Coming to a PC Near You

While you are online paying utility bills or setting up an automatic mortgage payment, have you ever mused, "I sure wish I could send my tithes and offerings to Messiah Lutheran as easily as I pay my bills." Well, soon you will be able to go online on your PC or Mac, 24/7, and schedule a one time or automatically recurring offering to any fund or activity at MLC. The new Online Giving program was approved by Council for roll out in September.

This web based program will allow you complete flexibility from the security of your home or office using your personal user name and password. After initial enrollment via any web browser, you'll be able to start, stop or modify single or periodic offerings in just a few key strokes. The church will receive your offering on the date you select, while you will have full control of personal reports and changes. Since our Financial Secretary will be the only one that sees your individual gifts as he electronically imports them into our offering data base, you will have the security of your confidential giving while still receiving the same periodic offering reports you now receive. Reports will now include all the gifts you give via the offering plate, your Online Giving, and other donations to Messiah. Soon you'll no longer have to rush to write your offering check or scurry through your wallet as the offering plate is being passed your way on Sunday.
