Jesus said, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's." -- Matthew 22:21

Dear Friends of the Reigning Messiah, (derived from my Sept. 18 sermon)

HOW MUCH AUTHORITY DOES OUR GOVERNMENT HAVE OVER US? That was at the root of a tricky tax question devised by religious authorities. "Is it lawful to pay taxes to the Emperor or not?" They were attempting to trap Jesus with that question. If Jesus says, 'yes', He will lose favor with the common people who were following

Him. If Jesus says, 'no', He will risk arrest by Roman Governor Pilate who was in Jerusalem to keep law and order during the Jewish Passover celebration. Jesus cleverly eluded their trap with the answer above. When it comes to taxes, it is like Jesus is saying...

"SEND BACK TO THE EMPEROR WHAT THE EMPEROR HAS COINED—that makes little difference. The truly IMPORTANT matter here is this: Give to God what is God's!" Jesus' words here do not eliminate the Emperor or God. Both have their place. So, using modern language: Where do we draw the line between church and state? As disciples we might ask it this way: Where do we draw the line between our Christian faith and our allegiance to this nation?

LET'S NOT ATTEMPT TO DRAW A STRAIGHT LINE in the sand between church and state. Instead, to diagram this, let us draw one VERY BIG circle. That circle represents **everything** on earth and in heaven. As Christians we believe **everything** is under God's authority. Then in our diagram, inside the large circle we can draw a much SMALLER circle. That circle would represent what is also under government authority.

EVERYTHING IS RIGHTFULLY UNDER GOD, including our 'one nation under God', as we say in our Pledge of Allegiance. While only SOME things are rightfully under the authority of the government. Jesus does not detach God and the Emperor. He just puts them in their proper places.

TO SUM THIS UP: JESUS IS SAYING, "The Emperor/the government CAN claim taxes from you and me. The very money we carry was made by our government to order our lives." But **Jesus' emphasis** falls on the second part of His reply, "Give to God the things that are God's" The striking way Jesus puts God and government together should open our eyes. Each has a place, but there are definite limits to the Emperor's power. Don't give the government your WORSHIP, or your SOUL. Our WHOLE EXIST-ENCE is from God. We belong to our Lord, not the government.

WHOMEVER WINS THE ELECTION, as Christians we should have the perspective to realize this is not what is MOST IMPORTANT for us. Our Lord and Savior will be Jesus in the coming years and forever. Jesus gave Himself totally, body and blood, for you. He is the ONLY LASTING AUTHORITY. Our only LASTING HOPE is the risen from the dead Jesus who lives and reigns forever and ever and ever. Hallelujah. Hallelujah. Hallelujah!

John Hughes (1873-1932) composed the tune "CWM RHONDDA" in 1905. It's been used for at least 44 hymns! Pastor/author Harry E. Fosdick (1878-1969) wrote the hymn's text. Fosdick was a professor of practical theology and served Baptist and Presbyterian churches in New Jersey and New York. The lyrics are a prayer for courage, wisdom, and faith: Lo! The host of evil round us Scorn the Christ, assail his ways!

From the fears that long have bound us

Free our hearts to faith and praise.

Grant us wisdom, grant us courage

For the living of these days, For the living of these days. -LBW 415 vs 2

If you click on the sender info, these are not legitimate mlutheran.org emails. Just block the sender's domain or report as spam.

COVID-19 TASK FORCE UPDATE

Messiah's Covid-19 Task Force continues to monitor and assess the pandemic's impact in our local area and advise MLC's Church Council. Based on the recommendations of the Task Force, church ministry groups can now meet in the Fellowship Hall and the Parish Hall with set limitations.

- 1. Fellowship Hall Maximum Occupancy is 8 persons.*
- 2. Parish Hall Maximum Occupancy is 12 persons.

Additionally, masks are required while inside the church. Physical distancing measures must also be in place and scheduling must be done in advance through the church office.

Facility use by external groups and individual members is not permitted at this time. Use of the education wing and the sanctuary are also not permitted.

*The Fellowship Hall is currently the staging area for the outdoor services, so the Parish Hall is recommended.

On Eagle's Wings Update

Christ Loves All People...

Virtual Bible Camp excerpt from Lesley Hand, Executive Director



On Eagle's Wings staff, volunteers, and partner dioceses worked together to create over 1000 virtual Bible Camp activity kits—including DVDs with 30 videos of Bible stories, crafts, and songs recorded by Bible Camp volunteers—to ensure that families from Grise Fiord, Resolute Bay, Tuktoyaktuk, Aklavik, Ft. McPherson, Behchoko, and Ft. Chipewyan received the Good News that Christ Loves All People. In addition, 30 families in the Diocese of Caledonia received kits, along with families in the Yukon, northern Alberta, and Pennsylvania.

Families received an activity kit for each of the 5 Bible stories in the CLAP! curriculum. And each kit contained a full-color booklet complete with prayers, the Bible story, craft instructions, and game suggestions, as well as the supplies needed to make all the crafts. The kits also came with a DVD that contained videos of *On Eagle's Wings* Bible Camp volunteers telling the Bible story, making the crafts, and singing songs from the curriculum.
