The Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. —John 1:14

Dear Friends of the Messiah,

"WE ARE PEOPLE OF THE WORD." I keep saying. What does that mean for us now? I believe we are at another "pivot point" in our life together as MLC. We pivoted when the pandemic caused us to discontinue in-person worship in March 2020. Now we pivot again in the early stages of returning to a new normal. What will it be like as we re-gather? We cannot know all the details, but we can be certain that God's Word and the Spirit of our risen Lord will go forward with us. This is especially good news for our graduates and Confirmands as they step into new realities in this ever-changing world.

"QUESTIONS" IS THE TITLE of the excerpt below from Frederick Buechner's book ***Beyond Words***. I found it helpful in assessing "things that matter always, life-and-death questions about meaning, purpose, and value." So I commend this to you as we seek our way ahead as MLC guided by the Word who became flesh and lived among us.

"ON HER DEATHBED. Gertrude Stein is said to have asked, 'What is the answer?' Then, after a long silence, 'What is the question?' Don't start looking in the Bible for the answers it gives. Start by listening for the questions it asks.

We are much involved, all of us, with questions about things that matter a good deal today but will be forgotten by this time tomorrow—the immediate wheres and whens and hows that face us daily at home and at work—but at the same time we tend to lose track of the questions about things that matter always, life-and-death questions about meaning, purpose, and value. To lose track of such deep questions as these is to risk losing track of who we really are in our own depths and where we are really going. There is perhaps no stronger reason for reading the Bible than that somewhere among all those India-paper pages there awaits each one of us, whoever we are, the one question that (though for years we may have been pretending not to hear it) is the central question of our individual lives. Here are a few of them:

- ? *For what will it profit them if they gain the whole world but forfeit their life? (Matthew 16:26)*
- ? *Am I my brother's keeper? (Genesis 4:9)*
- ? *If God is for us, who can be against us? (Romans 8:31)*
- ? *What is truth? (John 18:38)*
- ? *How can anyone be born after having grown old? (John 3:4)*
- ? *What do people gain from all the toil at which they toil under the sun? (Ecclesiastes 1:3)*
- ? *Whither shall I go from thy Spirit? (Psalm 139:7)*
- ? *Who is my neighbor? (Luke 10:29)*
- ? *What shall I do to inherit eternal life? (Luke 10:25)*
- ? *When you hear the question that is your question, then you have already begun to hear much. Whether you can accept the Bible's answer or not, you have reached the point where at least you can begin to hear it too."*

Outreach Spotlight: House of the Harvest by Claire Strand

House of the Harvest (HotH) was begun in 2015 by administrators and students of the Sparkman Middle School family in the Harvest/Toney area. On a typical Saturday, **HotH serves a hot breakfast and groceries to between 150-250 families at an old fire station facility-turned-food pantry.** During the COVID-19 pandemic, a drive-through was set up at Harvest Elementary School.

Feeding people isn't the number one priority, though; their mission is to point people to the Trinity— Father, Son, and Spirit— using what they call Priority One: prayer. Every guest is promised prayer. The food is what brings people together to receive it.

A few weeks ago, MLC was approached by HotH and asked to support a project to enlarge their back deck. The back deck is the seating area for the breakfast. It only seats 40 at a time. Too often people have to eat and run. The proposed new deck will seat 100, allowing more comfort and time to receive prayer and all the blessings that come from gathering in His name, including building relationships. Our gracious God enabled a generous gift from the people of MLC that got HotH near their fundraising goal. The new deck will be built later this summer.

On Saturday, June 12th, Messiah's outreach is planning a service day at HotH. No signup necessary- just show up at 7:15 a.m.

The address is 9144 Wall Triana Hwy. in Harvest, AL. Parking is across the street. Once the deck is completed, we will hold another service day at HotH.

This is a great way to see in person the wonderful mission of House of the Harvest.

Hymn of the Month: "Built on a Rock"

A Scandinavian hymn, the text was written by Nikolai F.S. Grundtvig (1783-1872). Grundtvig was a pastor and poet, among other things and "was one of the most influential people in Danish history as his philosophy gave rise to a new form of nationalism in the last half of the 19th century" (Dictionary of Hymnology). Norwegian composer and organist Ludvig M. Lindeman (1812-1887) composed the tune specifically for Grundtvig's text, which was, incidentally, the first hymn Lindeman composed.

*Through all the passing years, O Lord,
Grant that, when church bells are ringing,
Many may come to hear God's Word
Where he this promise is bringing:
I know my own, my own know me;
You, not the world, my face shall see;
My peace I leave with you. Amen.*

Wills: As a service to our members, MLC now offers a secure and fire-proof storage location for your Last Will & Testament documents. After you securely seal your documents in a marked envelope, they will be placed in a locked safe in the church for later retrieval, per your directions. All documents will be returned to you at your request at any time.

Emergency Contact Listing: Have you ever wished for a method to ensure your designated representative(s) are contacted in case of an accident or emergency? This could be especially important if your emergency contacts are not local and you are not able to make that vital contact. MLC will keep a private listing of your contact information as necessary. An Update from William Strand: *We're Minnesota Bound!*

Regarding my schooling, candidacy, and time in seminary, Kayla and I have gotten to the point where it is time for us to go on an internship. I was Endorsed to go on internship via my Candidacy committee, and then through the seminary we discerned a position at Bethlehem Lutheran Church and Trinity Lutheran Church as a joint internship.

I will be spending most of my time at Bethlehem with my supervisor while also spending part of my time at Trinity. Trinity has housing that they have opened to us, so we will be staying in their vicarage (effectively their parsonage).

Both congregations are in Grand Marais, Minnesota on the north shore of Lake Superior. It is a rural town and is the last township before the Canadian border. We are quite anxious to get started there and are making preparations now for the start on July 11th 2021.

This is the last step in my seminary education before I graduate, and we want to thank everyone at Messiah that has supported us and been part of my seminary education. Messiah has always been great to us. We are thankful for the leadership, education, and worship that I have been able to be a part of here and the programs that Kayla participated in as well.

WHY MASKS?

Why are we asking people to wear surgical masks on Sunday Mornings?

SHORT ANSWER: So, we can safely sing in worship.

DETAILS: MLC Council and Covid Task Force decided to allow singing in worship only after reviewing a study done by professors at MIT. <https://indoor-covid-safety.herokuapp.com/>

Dr. Rhonda Gaede, Chair of the Task Force, communicated with these professors and used their tools to calculate what could safely be done in our worship space. After discussing that study's conclusions, the Task Force and Council agreed it would be safe to allow singing in worship if those attending wore disposable surgical masks.

SPECIFICS:

UK Variant, Singing, Mask/Fit Compliance 95 %
 Surgical masks 100 people for 65 minutes
 Multiple layer cotton/silk 100 people for 20 minutes
 Cotton/flannel 100 people for 11 minutes
 No mask 100 people for 5 minutes

500 adult and 150 children's disposable surgical masks were ordered at a cost of 17 cents each. They will be given to worshipers entering the building this Sunday at 11:00 a.m.

That is WHY we are asking you to wear a surgical mask:
 So, we can safely sing.

(If you have not been vaccinated,
 Pastor Scott encourages it for everyone's safety.)
