Most merciful God,

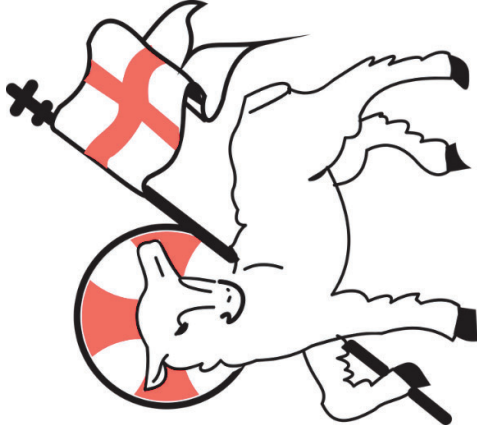
