

"Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you." (Matthew 17:20)

Take a look at the verse from Matthew 17 in the header of this page. Now that's faith! Can you even begin to imagine what it would be like to have enough faith to move a mountain? Over and over again, Jesus encourages his followers to increase their faith and remain connected to God, regardless of the situation or the cost.

The piece we often miss is that having faith also means putting our faith into action. Faith is not a quiet pastime that simply takes place in the comfort of our own home or once a week in a sanctuary. Faith is not something we tend to simply because we are young. Faith is challenging. Faith is groundbreaking. Faith is not comfortable. Faith disrupts the status quo. Having faith in God and what God has promised means we are willing to trust the Living God, regardless of the

answer or direction. If God's answer is "no," then we accept it. If God's answer is "yes," then we do what is

necessary to follow God's direction. If God's answer is "not now" or "not that way..." we are to heed God's direction... for the good of ALL.

Unfortunately, all too often, words like faith, hope, and love have become more about keeping the status quo, believing we know better than God and trying to discover a way out of doing what God requires. This is even true for those of us who would call ourselves the Children of God. Too often we find ourselves never changing, stuck in our old ways, and refusing to allow God to transform us.

The following anonymous quote came across my desk several years ago, but still causes me to pause: "Faith can move mountains, but don't be surprised if God hands you a shovel!"

I've said it many times and will certainly say it again: "Our God is a Living God." This means that as God's Children, we too are living. I'm not talking about living in the sense that our hearts beat, we take in breath, or even that we grow taller and sometimes wider. I'm speaking of us being **LIVING** beings—people who strive to better themselves and those around them by God's Holy Word. People who take to heart that, when we remain in the status quo, God's forgiveness has made no impact, because we have refused to start over and do better this time around. People who not only "listen" to God's Word but proclaim God's Word by what they say and what they do. People who encourage, uplift, and walk difficult paths because that's what God requires.

Facility Use Policy Updated by MLC Council

On August 10, 2023, Messiah's Council approved an updated version of MLC's Facility Use Policy. The updated version can be viewed here

New MLC Facility Use Policy

The majority of edits pertained to formatting; however, there were two substantive changes:

1. Rules and Regulations #7: Alcohol. The old policy did not permit alcohol on church property. The updated policy is as follows:

- All non-member groups, or groups that will include participants under the age of 21, must obtain MLC Council approval to serve alcohol.
- Hard liquor is not permitted.
- Events serving alcohol must also have nonalcoholic beverages available.
- Event sponsors are responsible for ensuring:
 - No accidental or deliberate consumption/possession of alcohol by individuals under the age of 21;
 - Intoxicated persons are not served.
 - Groups hosting events that will involve the sale of alcohol agree to follow all City of Huntsville, Madison County, and State of Alabama ordinances regarding special event permits and alcohol permits.
 - Alcohol may only be stored on church property during the setup and event time, and must be removed at the conclusion of the event.
- 2. Rules and Regulations #9: Sales in MLC's Narthex. This provision states:
 - The Narthex should not be used as a venue for sale of goods/items.
